Early Head Start Annual Report
2010-2011

The Early Head Start (EHS) at Kingsbridge Heights Community Center is a program serving families and children from pregnancy through age three years. The program is designed to provide early support to families of infants and toddlers, support which will enhance the child's development through healthy beginnings and the continuity of responsive and caring relationships. The goal of EHS is to foster the intellectual, social and emotional growth of both parent and child. Parents and children can participate in the three program options offered, Combination Program Option, Family Child Care Program Option or the Pregnancy Program Option.

Audit Results

March 2010: Kingsbridge Heights Community Center is in full compliance with the applicable Head Start Program Standards, laws, regulations, and policy requirements during the Tri-annual Federal Monitoring Review.

October 2011: Kingsbridge Heights Community Center completed its annual audit by BDO Seidman, LLC for fiscal year ending June 30, 2011, which indicated compliance with each of its major federal programs

80 % of families are low income families living in the Bronx

42 % of families are two-parent families

56 % of families are working

15 % of families are in school

29 % of families have a high school degree/GED, 36 % have some college and 16.7 % a Bachelor degree or higher education

69 % of families participate in WIC

Children enrolled: 25.5 % infants, 32.5 % toddlers and 42 % two-year-olds

Children: 84 % Latino, 12.6 % African American, 2.4 % Biracial, 1 % White

16 families experienced homelessness during the program year
