


The Kingsbridge Heights Community Center was founded in 1974 by a group of passionate community organizers. The group was led by three neighborhood women: Mary McLoughlin, Patricia Burns, and Janet Athanasidy.

Upon hearing in 1972 that the 50th Precinct was moving out of its turn-of-the-century building on Kingsbridge Terrace, the three jumped at the opportunity to realize their vision for a community center

Today, KHCC offers programs and services for all ages and is an active member of United Neighborhood Houses of New York City and United Neighborhood Centers of America. From the adaptive reuse of our historic building to our responsive programs, the Kingsbridge Heights Community Center represents a crucial piece of the fabric of New York City.

Together, we commit to accomplishing greater feats in serving children and families in the Bronx, and providing them with numerous forms of support as they strive to create better, brighter futures for themselves.





EARLY CHILDHOOD

We give quality early education to children from birth to 5 years old and support caregivers as they develop skills to become nurturing, effective caregivers.



YOUTH

We create a safe, welcoming environment during afterschool hours where young people can socialize, learn, and build character.



ADULT AND FAMILY

We provide a range of services and supports to adults and families that help break generational cycles of abuse, neglect, family violence, and poverty.

INTRODUCING KHCCONNECT

At the end of 2017, we launched KHCConnect, an agency-wide case management system. KHCConnect ensures our families are connected to the services they need to create physically, emotionally, and financially healthy family units, including Parenting Journey and connections to job opportunities.




EARLY CHILDHOOD

SERVICE DESCRIPTION

Our programs include elementary and middle school afterschool, summer day camp; a Teen Center for high school aged youth to develop leadership skills; College Directions focused on high school as well as post-secondary education success; and a Respite program for young people, up to age 25, with special needs.

2018 DEPARTMENT HIGHLIGHTS

- Awarded a grant to redirect Court-Involved Youth (provide mentorship, mental health support, and guidance) already or at-risk of becoming part of the court system into our Teen Center, including College Directions for positive outcomes
- Received 15 seat passenger vehicle donated by Big John's Moving, which takes our Special Needs participants home and our College Directions participants on trips

DIVISION DESCRIPTION

Programs in this division include Changing Futures, an intervention for survivors of child sexual abuse and their non-offending family members; Parenting Journey designed to help struggling parents learn self-care and parenting skills; ESOL classes; and adult, family, and senior recreation.






2018 DEPARTMENT HIGHLIGHTS

- As one of most respected trauma recovery providers in the Bronx, was awarded a 55% increase from Mayor's Office of Criminal Justice as part of NYC's Sexual Assault Initiative to expand services to survivors of abuse
- Secured a groundbreaking grant from New York Community Trust and a renewed grant from the O'Neil Foundation to create KHCConnect, an intradepartmental arm that assesses urgent (housing, food, etc) to necessary (trauma support, English classes, etc) needs of families and connects them with appropriate resources for positive outcomes
- Became part of NYC Parks GreenThumb, the largest community gardening program in the nation, which provides programming and material support to over 550 gardens


